

Hello Yellow

This beanie is worked in the round from bottom up. The brim is worked with knitting through the back loop, which gives it a firm feeling and a linear look. Adding stitches before starting the cable will create a fuller look for the finished piece. The decreases guided will form a flower crown pattern on top of this beautiful beanie. Measures for the larger size is within (parenthesis). Please check your gauge.

MATERIALS

- ♥ About 219 - 273 yards (200 - 250 m) DK (11 wpi) weight non-itchy yarn. (I used Gjestal SW Merinoull, about 110g for the adult size, Drops Merino Extra fine will also work.)
- ♥ US 4 - 3,5 mm circular needle + cable needle if needed
- ♥ US 4 - 3,5 mm double pointed needles for decreasing
- ♥ (optional US 6 - 4,0 mm circular needle + cable needle if needed, for the cable)
- ♥ fake fur pompom, or extra yarn and a pompom maker

SIZE

This pattern is for two sizes: adult 58-62 cm / 22, 5-24 inches and young 55-57 cm / 21-22, 5 inches. The measurements for the adult size are instructed within the **(parentheses)**. Gauge for this pattern approx. 23 stitches = 4 inches/10 cm.



ABBREVIATIONS

DPN	double pointed needles
S/STS	stitch (es)
SS	stockinette stich
K	knit
P	purl
KBL	knit through the back loop
MC	slip one (or place onto cable needle in front of the work)
	knit one, knit the slipped stitch (from the cable needle)
S3BK3	slip 3 sts (onto cable needle) leave in back of the work, K 3 sts, then K 3 slipped sts (from cable needle)
S3FS3	slip 3 sts onto cable needle, leave in front of the work, K 3 sts and then K 3 sts (from cable needle)
K2ST	knit two STS together
S1K1P	slip one, knit one, pass slipped S over the knitted one.
P2T	purl two STS together.

Pattern

BRIM

Cast on 110 (118) STS on circular needle. Join to knit in the round. Work the brim with knitting *P 1 and KBL 1* repeat through the first round and continue until the brim height measures 5 (5,5)" / 13 (14) cm. Turn the work, so you start to knit the next row in the opposite direction.

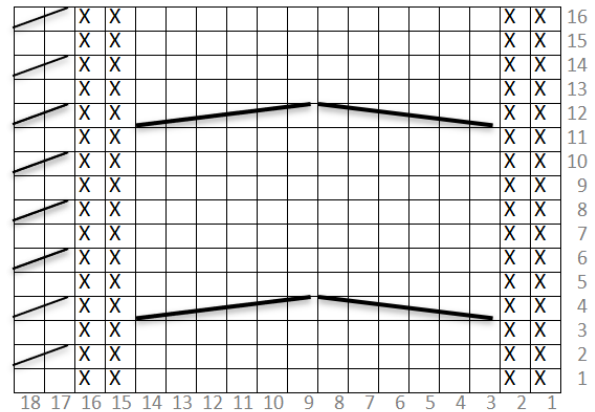
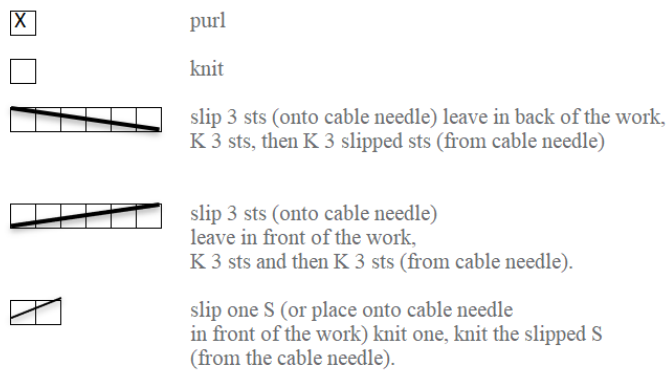
Note! If by turning the work, you leave a hole in your piece. Pick the root of the last stitch (from the row before) onto your left needle and knit with the first stitch of the row. This should prevent the hole.



CABLE

K stockinette through one round, add evenly 16 (26) STS. Now the total STS of the work is 126 (144) STS. The whole cable pattern consists total of 18 STS and it will be repeated 7 (8) times during one round.

Note! I have noticed that you may prevent loose loops in your cables, by knitting the last stitch of your cable through the back loop. So the loops 9 and 14 in below chart, apply only to rows 4 and 12.



1. round: *P 2, K 12, P 2, K2* repeat round to the end 7 (8) times.
2. round: *P 2, K 12, P 2, MC* repeat round to the end 7 (8) times.
3. round: *P 2, K 12, P 2, K2* repeat round to the end 7 (8) times.
4. round: *P 2, S3BK3, S3FS3, MC* repeat round to the end 7 (8) times.
5. round: *P 2, K 12, P 2, K2* repeat round to the end 7 (8) times.
6. round: *P 2, K 12, P 2, MC* repeat round to the end 7 (8) times.
7. round: *P 2, K 12, P 2, K2* repeat round to the end 7 (8) times.
8. round: *P 2, K 12, P 2, MC* repeat round to the end 7 (8) times.

Now start again from the 1st row. These above rounds are repeated total of 6 (7) times before starting the decreases. The ready peace consists of 5 (6) whole cables and a half of a cable. The last round before decreasing is the cable round.

DECREASES

The decreases are worked with **every round**.

1. round of decreases: *P2T* repeat through the whole round, this applies to all purl STS. After these decreases you have total of 112 (128) STS in your work.
2. round of decreases: *S1K1P* (or you can use SSK=slip, slip, knit) in the beginning of all cables and *K2ST* for the last two STS of every cable. (not the MC! though)
3. round of decreases: Repeat as the 2nd round of decreases until you have 4 STS left in your cables and a total of 56 (64) STS in your work.
4. If needed, decrease the next round(s) with K2ST, applying to all STS until the work is left with around 20 STS.

FNISHING

Cut the yarn and pull through the remaining STS. Secure the ends. Steam/bath the beanie.
